CAN LONGHOUGHTON 20MPH SCHEME BE IMPROVED?

The 20mph scheme through Longhoughton has been in operation now for two years and was introduced following a vote in favour by the residents. Common opinion is that it has resulted in a reduction in traffic speed, but the 20mph limit is not being recognised by some drivers, and there are still concerns about the speed with which drivers approach and enter the village. A reduction in speed is good but many people want to see wider compliance for safety reasons.

The Parish Council has been reviewing the whole scheme and has talked to County Council and AONB officials about the options. There



is a definite view that the scheme can be improved but evidence of the speed of vehicles is required first. Speed strips will soon be installed. In other villages, ramps and chicanes are used to slow down the traffic. These were rejected by residents in the last review, but in the future these may

be reconsidered along with flashing speed signs.

It is a key aim of the Parish Council to work with partners to make the Parish a safe place and we will be asking for your views as we go through the process.

LONGHOUGHTON CLIMATE CHANGE ACTION GROUP

Northumberland County Council recently set up a programme to reduce the use of carbon-based fuels and it is encouraging communities to set up their own groups to change things locally. Longhoughton Parish Council considered this at its meeting on 18 November and would like to set up a Climate Change Action Group to act as a steering group. Grants are available to employ professionals to carry out feasibility studies. The areas that the Group could look at are:

- Encourage buying electric vehicles and installing charging points
- Set up community renewable energy schemes
- Encourage 'green' buying schemes
- Encourage more walking and cycling, including electric bikes
- Facilitate bulk purchasing to enable conversion to sources of renewable energy
- Increase tree planting
- Help householders with guidance and information on insulation and energy efficiency

Howick & Boulmer News

BOULMER CAR PARK DEVELOPMENTS

In October Longhoughton Parish Council (LPC) considered the long awaited feasibility report compiled by the County Council (NCC) for a new car park in Boulmer to be sited, as expected, next to the Boulmer Memorial Hall (BMH). The suggestion for this came out of the Boulmer Review in 2017 and the drop-in event run by NCC in January 2018. Boulmer residents subsequently voted on whether they wanted a new car park and the result was 13 in favour and 3 against.

The report put forward five possible options. The option for forty three parking places at an estimated cost of £73,500 was recommended. The Parish Council accepted the recommended design and layout but has suggested that the size could be restricted to around thirty vehicles to be more in line with the original identified need. The proposed car park is to eliminate the congestion that exists from St Andrew's Church corner to the public toilets. This will act as a car park for events at BMH, and for St Andrew's gallery and an overspill for the FBI. Residents will be able to use the proposed car park including those who do not have off-street parking.

The report suggested the use of double yellow lines from St Andrew's Church corner to the public toilets to prevent vehicle parking in this congested area and to encourage the use of the car park.

Another issue is the visual impact of the car park particularly from the west. Ways to lessen the impact will be essential and stone walls and hedging are being considered.

NCC is now updating their plans for the comments of LPC and an updated version will come back for further consideration. This will be discussed by LPC and residents will be advised of the suggested proposals. BOULMER WILDFLOWER MEADOW

The annual cutting of the grass at the meadow took place in mid-October. The grass was cut with specialist equipment. It was then turned twice to dry before being baled by machine with the kind assistance of the Howick Estate. Overall 76 bales were produced and a large quantity of grass taken to Alnwick for composting. After cutting the meadow was re-seeded with yellow rattle and seeds of other species. We are hoping for a bumper crop of wild flowers from February through to September next year. Many thanks go to the volunteers from Boulmer, volunteers from Coast Care and to Lord Howick for the help given by the Howick Estate.

LONGHOUGHTON TO BOULMER ROAD FLOODING

Thanks to the County Council for installing drainage gullies on the road close to Boulmer in places that have flooded in past years. The Parish Councillor for Boulmer also met Highways representatives to look at the places that flood between the RAF Camp and Longhoughton. Photographic evidence of the flooding was taken recently and sent to the Council. Hopefully solutions to avoid the flooding will be implemented in 2020.

VACANCIES FOR PARISH COUNCILLORS

Longhoughton Parish Council has three vacant positions for Councillors, two at Boulmer and one at Howick. No previous experience is required but candidates should have a desire to serve the local community and to see it thrive. There are ten meetings of the Council each year. The positions are voluntary. There are no party political divisions in the Parish Council so party politics does not come into the discussions. From the Local Council elections in 2021 the County Council has agreed that Longhoughton Parish will continue to have ten councillors but there will be 6 for Longhoughton Ward, and 2 each for Boulmer and Howick Wards

LONGHOUGHTON, BOULMER AND HOWICK DEVELOPMENT PLAN

This has previously been referred to as the Neighbourhood Development Plan. Jo-Anne Garrick (Ltd) has been appointed as the Planning Consultancy to advise the Steering Group and undertake specialist work. This appointment will be paid out of grant funding received from Government sources. Her first assignment is to produce a scoping report that will be presented to the Steering Group on 2 December 2019. This report will look at what the Group has done so far, will identify any gaps in evidence and will establish a policy framework. The Steering Group will then be in a position to establish a clear programme for the remainder of the project and the production of the Development Plan.

All residents will be consulted on the work so far in January 2020. This will cover the vision and objectives for the years to 2036 and how the community would like to see land used over this period. People will also be asked about what is important to them. We will be offering drop-in sessions in Longhoughton, Boulmer and Howick and there will be a special Development Plan publication circulated to all households in early January.
