LONGHOUGHTON PARISH COUNCIL TO SIGN THE ARMED FORCES COVENANT

The Parish Council is to sign the Armed Forces Covenant. A resolution was passed unanimously at the April meeting and preparations are being made for a signing ceremony.

The primary purpose of signing the Covenant is to demonstrate the Parish's commitment to the armed forces and particularly the RAF, and to bring the military and civilian communities closer together. The area is unique in having Royal Air Force Boulmer within the Parish.

Adrian Hinchcliffe, Chair of Longhoughton Parish Council said "It makes absolute sense to sign the Covenant for there are 150 houses in Longhoughton which are the homes of military families and many ex-military personnel and veterans have settled in the parish as residents. Also, the RAF is a major part of the community and RAF Boulmer is our largest employer."

The Covenant is a pledge that together we acknowledge and understand that those who serve or who have served in the armed forces, and their families, should be treated with fairness and respect in the communities, economy and society they serve with their lives.

David Keighley, Commander of RAF Boulmer said, "On behalf of serving personnel and veterans in the area, I wholeheartedly welcome the signing of the Armed Forces Covenant by the Longhoughton Parish Council. Service life often comes with its own unique challenges, especially for our families. So I am very grateful to the Parish Council for acknowledging these challenges through signing the Covenant. This act reinforces our joint commitment to ensuring that military personnel (and their families) are not unduly disadvantaged by their 'nomadic' lifestyle."

LONGHOUGHTON, BOULMER AND HOWICK OVER THE LAST 70 YEARS

We are indebted to the Parish Heritage Group for looking back at how our villages have changed since the Queen's Coronation in 1953 and below they feature some of the changes that have happened during this period. To take this further the Group needs your help! If you have any photographs or anecdotes from the last 70 years we would love to show them at the Platinum Jubilee Celebration on 5 June. Do you remember any of these events?

June 1953 – A thousand children from local schools, including Longhoughton County Primary, sang Elizabethan ballads and danced in green, yellow and red outfits at a pageant at Alnwick Castle to celebrate the Coronation. Anyone attending might remember the colours of the outfits, but also the terrible weather which cancelled some of the performances. There was a lot of mud.

June 1962 – Longhoughton Railway Station closes. It used to boast an impressive station building, as did all the stations on this line, thanks to the architect Benjamin Green, whose work also included the Penshaw Monument and Greys Monument in Newcastle.

October 1975 – A NATO-wide exercise resulted in mobile wailing sirens going off around Longhoughton in the early hours, followed by cars and lorries "screaming through the village". This was to wake

up key RAF personnel to respond to the alert. Some locals were not amused. Do you remember being woken up?

June 1977 – The Longhoughton WI dedicated a new flower bed at the church to the Queen for the Silver Jubilee, planted with different varieties of roses. Do you recognise any of the group pictured here with Reverend Priestner? January 1993 – Fossils often turn up on local beaches, but this was a rare find of the footprint of a temnospondy, a creature which looked like a predecessor of a frog and moved like a crocodile. The footprint was eight inches long and four inches wide, giving a step of 18 inches. The climate here 300 million years ago was swampy, like the Florida Everglades now.

ANNUAL PARISH MEETING

PROPOSED CLOSURE OF LONGHOUGHTON SURGERY

We are still awaiting for contact from Alnwick Medical Group on the outcome of their consultation. Several residents attended the April Parish Council meeting in the hope that we had some good news. Many elderly people and young families are very concerned about the proposed closure. We need a positive outcome.

LONGHOUGHTON PARISH QUARRIES LIAISON GROUP

The Parish Council has approved the setting up of a Liaison Group Longhoughton and Howick Quarries. Both quarries welcome this proposal as it will lead to improved communications with the community on routine operations and future plans.

The Liaison Group will consist of parish councillors, the County Councillor for Longhoughton, a representative from the local business/farmers and up to eight residents. ANTI-SOCIAL BEHAVIOUR

Following a recent number of incidents of vandalism and anti-social behaviour a Liaison Group has been set up with Northumbria Police. This group will meet quarterly. The police have stepped up their patrols in the areas where these have been happening. Let us hope that positive actions can eliminate any further anti-social acts.

HOWICK BURN BRIDGE AND THE PERMISSIVE FOOTPATH

Coast Care has agreed to undertake most of the ancillary work and agreement has been reached with all parties. The next step is to apply for the funding with a view to the project going ahead in late summer.

LACEY STREET PARKING

Following the installation of a CCTV camera which was in place for one week the County Council have said that the survey has been reviewed with no significant anomalies.

The bulk of Running Fox customers appear to park in the Running Fox car park. The majority of cars parked on Lacey Street appear to be residents and although there is increased activity at school pick-up and drop-off times it is not significant, with the odd vehicle either parking in the car park or driving through to the bottom of Lacey Street to pick up close to the school.

SHOREBIRDS

A big thank-you goes to the small but beautifullyformed group of willing pickers who cleaned up the village on 23 April – it was an amazing amount of litter we picked in just 90 minutes - big shout-out especially to little Finn for all his sterling efforts!





It has been a very busy few months for us as shore nesting bird season is well underway! With the help of dedicated ringed plover surveyors from Coast Care, we have been monitoring the progress of nesting ringed plovers and protecting their vulnerable nests from disturbance and accidental trampling. Elsewhere on the coast, the dune grasslands are in peak flower at this time of year! Orchids, bloody cranesbill and bird's foot trefoil are just a few examples of beautiful wildflowers in bloom right now, providing an essential source of food to pollinators, which in turn are vital food for birds and their young.

Many of Northumberland's dune grasslands are internationally important, and we have a vital role in conserving them, keeping the system healthy for the huge diversity of wildlife which they support. MARTIN STEPHENSON & THE DAINTEES




