The names of the individuals and teams are given below all in alphabetical order. We thank them all for the time and effort that they give to our community.

INDIVIDUAL AWARDS

ANDREW WILLMOTT

Dr Andrew Wilmott as an exceptional volunteer for his work as Churchwarden to St Peter and St Paul Church in Longhoughton. He is the driving force behind the Parish Church, organising volunteer rotas, leading worship, organising and carrying out maintenance. He is the lay chair of the Parochial Church Council and the main contact with the Parish Council and the village community. He approaches all tasks with diligence, patience and good humour. The church and the community would be poorer without his guiding hand. Without doubt he goes the extra mile to serve the village community by keeping St Peter and St Paul's church at the centre of our spiritual community and proclaiming the good news of the resurrection of Our Lord Jesus Christ.

CHARLOTTE CONNOR AND DEBBIE BOULTER

Charlotte Connor and Debbie Boulter of Company B are exceptional volunteers in our community. They go above and beyond to support anyone who is in need within the community. Although Charlotte runs her own business, she does an enormous amount of work to support the community.

His input has been phenomenal; voted club helper of the year 2022/23 he has continued to contribute to the ongoing success of LRFC. He picked up the reins of running the Under-13 team when an unexpected vacancy arose. He is a qualified groundsman and now maintains both grass pitches and the club mower. He is currently in the process of obtaining a groundsman's kit grant to further improve our already excellent facilities. He can be found opening the Community and Sports Centre on a Saturday to ensure the footballers and supporters don't go hungry or thirsty.

MARTIN MAWER

Martin is **Longhoughton Rangers Football Club** (LRFC) Under-8/9 manager, player/manager/coach of the Adult team. He is also a Committee member on the FA North Northumberland League (NNL). This year he has stepped up to add value to LRFC. His main achievement has been as chief negotiator in securing Westfield Park as a NNL mini-league venue (Under-7/8). With three local clubs already invested this looks certain to grow in the 23/24 season. He made such an impression he was invited to join the League committee as a full member, securing for the club a say in decision-making in Northumberland. He is an advocate of the newly formed adult team and has been appointed as Men's 1st team manager for 23/24. BOULMER CAR PARKS

A meeting has taken place with representatives of the County Council to ask for a progress report on the proposed new car park next to the Memorial Hall and the offer for the County to take over responsibility for the existing Beach Car Park. In 2019 and in 2021 the County Council had promised that the new car park would be built following discussion involving the Leader of the County Council and support from a survey of local people. The County Council presented an update on the progress but this included new information. The Parish Council has asked for more details and evidence to support what was put forward so that it can be better understood and assessed.

BOULMER MEMORIAL HALL

LONGHOUGHTON PARISH HERITAGE GROUP

A huge thank-you to everyone who came along to the Heritage stall at the Longhoughton Coronation Celebration! We had so many interesting conversations about everything from plague pits to herring sheds, Sandilands to Boot hill, and unexploded bombs to prehistoric axe heads. We were showing the work we have done so far on making a plan of the historic gravestones in St Peter and Paul Churchyard.

As part of this we are recording what remains of these old inscriptions, researching family trees and uncovering stories. From 1951 to 1956 the vicar campaigned for the churchyard wall to be repaired as it was falling into the road, and it was decided to remove soil and relocate 5 graves. You can see the former outline of the graveyard where the grass and pavement are currently. In 1959 Reverend Crawley relocated 31 old headstones along the south wall from the churchyard to create space for flowerbeds. Do you remember these changes? We are hoping to hold an event looking at what we've uncovered so far for Heritage Open Days in

Ringed Plover Chick

With the shorebird breeding season now in full swing, it is an exciting and busy time for us at Space for Shorebirds. We are lucky that both Ringed Plovers and Oystercatchers choose to breed on the beaches of the Northumberland coast. Both species make their nests directly on the sand and shingle of our beaches and their eggs are fantastically camouflaged to avoid predators. Unfortunately, this can make them particularly vulnerable to being accidentally trodden on. If you see any of our nest protection sites when out on the coast:

Stay well clear of the fences to avoid disturbing the nesting birds; **Follow the advice** of any of our rangers or signs at the site; **Keep dogs under control** around nesting areas, as there may be chicks feeding outside of the fences.

Thanks for caring about our fabulous beach nesting birds, and fingers crossed for another great breeding season!
