LONGHOUGHTON BEACH CAR PARK: PROPOSALS TO CHARGE FOR PARKING By David Baring, Chair of Howick Trustees

"Sugar Sands", "Howdiemont Sands", "Longhoughton Beach" or simply "The Beach" – whatever name has been used in your house – is part of all our lives and a wonderful asset for our area. It has appeared in numerous press articles as an idyllic location and is now very much a local destination.

This increase popularity has created its own problems:

- 1. The traffic down Beach Road with increased cars the peaceful route to walk down to the beach through Lowsteads Farm and past the Forsyth's magnificent hedges can be fraught with dodging hot-hatches and discovering that hedges can have thorns!
- 2. The parking on the dunes had become like the wild west. With ever expanding territory and folk trying to camp on a regular basis. Destroying the habitat.

The dunes running from Burnmouth south are part of the Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty (AONB) and a Site of Special Scientific Interest (SSSI) and need to bemanaged and preserved. The site is owned by Howick Trustees Ltd, the charity which owns and runs Howick Gardens and Arboretum. The Forsyths graze their cattle on the dunes for periods of the year to maintain the biodiversity.

In order to improve the situation, there have been a series of meeting between the Parish Council, Howick Trustees, AONB team and the Forsyths. The stones were installed last year and have weathered in well. The grass is recovering and parking is restricted to the original parking area designed decades ago.

Management of the area has relied on the goodwill of a few individuals voluntarily going down to open and close the gate and moving try-it-on campers off the site. This is not sustainable in the longterm. As such Howick Trustees will be introducing a modest parking charge for day visitors and allowing the purchase of season tickets for the community. Charges will be similar to those along the coast (e.g. Alnmouth - £3.50 day ticket, £25 season ticket). This will allow us to employ a team to manage the area and provide additional services to inform about the coast and what it offers.

As a charity, Howick Trustees, will use any surplus income to fund activities in line with their charitable objectives (heritage, environment and education). It is proposed the allocation of this will be discussed with a group made up of Howick Trustees, the Parish Council and Lowsteads Farm. The funds raised for the Longhoughton Church will continue as part of this process.

A website is being developed where more information will be published as it becomes available and ultimately it is hoped it will become a resource to inform about the coastline and what it offers. Watch this space: www.Longhoughtonbeach.co.uk when it goes live.

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

LONGHOUGHTON PARISH QUARRIES LIAISON GROUP

The Group met for the first time on 16 June 2023, Adrian Hinchclifffe was elected as the chair and Robert Nicholson as the Vice Chair. David Love, a Senior Planning officer of the County Council, reviewed the reports on blasting over the last two years and also the complaints raised by residents. It was noted that the blasts have all been within the acceptable range for vibration and even the one on 27.03.23 was within the range. David confirmed that the Government set the allowable range within the National Planning Guidelines and not the County Council. It was confirmed that the Quarry Operator MGL are operating within Government Guidelines. David said that he was aware of complaints from residents about the impact of blasting vibration on their properties. He suggested that one way forward to deal with this is under the Environment Protection Act where possible property damage is seen as a nuisance. This is to be taken up with the Environment Services Section of the County Council. Network Rail are aware of the blasting at the quarry and carry out their own liaison with Longhoughton Quarry.

REPORTING TO THE POLICE

Northumbria Police will always advise anyone to dial 999 in an emergency or in an incident that requires an immediate police response. For all other reports, dial 101 or alternatively the Northumbria Police Website (Home: Northumbria Police). These are great tools for keeping the Police informed of local community issues so that they can act upon concerns of the community.

Reporting on the website is straightforward. By clicking "Report It" members of the community will be taken to "Report an Incident" which proceeds to ask if the incident is an emergency and to ensure that the report is going through the correct method. More and more residents are using online web submissions to inform the police of local community issues and are finding it quick and easy to use.

The County Council are planning to introduce kerbside glass collection across the County in 2024/25 subject to Government support and funding.

LONGHOUGHTON ROWERS HELP RAISE OVER £2,500 FOR THE RNLI

A number of Longhoughton residents recently took part in the 24-hour Solstice Row undertaken by Alnmouth Community Rowing Club (ACR) in aid of the RNLI. The aim was to raise £600 for Amble RNLI Station through donations including cake sales. The target was significantly exceeded with more than £2,575 raised.

About 40 rowers were organised in to one-hour shifts, with crews of five in each of the two skiff boats to ensure constant rowing between 10am on the 15 June and 10am on the 16. The weather

was spectacular and so was nature, with dolphins, seals, puffins and orca keeping the rowers company in the waters between Boulmer and Alnmouth Bay. A stunning 24 hours was rounded off with a celebratory breakfast BBQ at the Old Boathouse.

A SCAR ON THE LANDSCAPE

Longhoughton residents will have noticed the mast that has appeared on the road leading up the hill from Longhoughton towards Alnwick. This is a significant scar on the landscape. Its purpose is to give a signal to people who are travelling on trains on the East Coast Main Line – so that they have continuous access to a signal on this section of the line. Longhoughton Parish Council objected to the mast going up in its present position due to its impact on the scenic beauty of the area. Our objection was rejected by the County Council who approved the planning application.

The County Council has agreed to take over the existing Beach car park and this should take place in Spring 2024. It will become a paycar park. The County Council has nominated an officer to work with the Parish Council on a parking strategy for the whole village. With regard to the proposed new car park next to the Memorial Hall there is doubt whether planning permission can be obtained. This is being further investigated by the County Council.

MEMORIAL SEAT ON BOULMER DUNES IN MEMORY OF HAZEL AND JOHN STEPHENSON

This seat has been renewed recently in memory of Hazel and John Stephenson who were very active members of the Boulmer community. Hazel and John met when Hazel was stationed in Northumberland in the WAAF during the war. They lived just over the road from the location of the bench. Hazel ran the village shop and post office. She was a Brown Owl for the local Brownies group, ran the village whist drives in the village hall and was an active member of the church. John was a fisherman,

John was a fisherman, auxiliary coastguard, parish councillor, school governor, church warden, and a founder member of the Boulmer Volunteer Rescue Service that was created when the RNLI withdrew from the village. He also served in the Royal Navy during the Second World War. They were both very community minded and it is appropriate that they are remembered.
