# DRAFT NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN CONSULTATION THE RESPONSES

Thank you to the 97 residents who sent in a response form along with the 43 who attended the exhibition and drop-in events. Additionally 17 statutory consultees and other businesses/ organisations responded to the consultation. Overall the level of support from residents for the draft policies is strong with 14 policies receiving in excess of 80% and the lowest level of support being 62%.

The steering group are in the process of reviewing comments and will discuss and agree the changes that need to be made to the plan, in response to the feedback, before presenting an updated draft plan to the Parish Council who will need to approve it before it is submitted to the County Council for examination. Residents will be made aware of what is being released to the County Council and there will be a further opportunity to comment on the submission draft plan via a consultation organised by the County Council. The plan will then be assessed by an independent examiner, amendments made to reflect comments and then there will be a referendum, where all those registered to vote in the parish will be able to say if they think the plan should be adopted.

There were a number of misconception which came through in theresponses and two of these are covered below.

## Parking at Longhoughton Co-op and the suggestion of a Plaza.

The Steering Group and Parish Council would like it to be known that there are absolutely no plans to restrict the parking outside the Co-op. If anything the parking needs to be expanded.



#### **Permanent Occupation of Properties**

Policy LBH8 proposes permanent occupation for all new properties in Boulmer Ward. Many people in their responses said that permanent occupation should be a proposal for the whole Parish. A policy of 'permanent occupation' is only applicable for Boulmer Ward for the following reason.

There is an overriding Northumberland-wide policy that says 'permanent occupation' is only permissible where the number of second homes and holiday lets exceeds 20%. Within the Parish of Longhoughton we have the following levels of second homes

# THE DIGITAL PHONE SWITCHOVER

The Uk's telephone network is changing. Between now and 2025 most telephone providers will be moving their customers from the old analogue landlines over to new upgraded landline systems using digital technology. This may have already happened to some customers who have switched to full fibre broadband. People who use personal alarms or health monitoring devices should check if the switchover will affect how they work. Digital landlines cannot carry a power connection, so in the event of a power cut they will not work. Mobile phones will still work. However, if you have no other means of making an emergency call please make sure that you inform your telecoms provider.

Following all the discussion about the status of the lane from Longhoughton to the beach car park at Longhoughton beaches (via Low Steads Farm), the Parish Council is asking the County Council to give it the status of a 'Quiet Lane'. This would mean that walkers and cyclists would be given much greater priority than motor vehicles. There are Quiet Lanes in many English Counties but not Northumberland. In Scotland they call them 'Walking and Cycling Friendly Roads'.

DOG POO: People are complaining throughout the Parish about the amount of dog poo that is not being picked up. We know that it is a small minority of dog owners who are not picking up and spoiling the situation for those who are responsible. Failing to clean up after your dog/s is unacceptable. Dog fouling is one of the top environmental priorities and one of the issues most commonly raised by residents. Not only is it unpleasant but dog dirt can carry serious diseases which can cause blindness and liver disorders, and children are the most susceptible. In Northumberland there are fines of up to  $\pounds1,000$  for not picking up dog poo which applies anywhere in the open air.

# **BOULMER CAR PARKS**

The County Council is still waiting to hear from English Nature on the status of the proposed location for the new car park next to Boulmer Memorial Hall. The County Ecologist has expressed the view that the construction of a car park in the field could have an impact on wild birds which are on the endangered list. The Parish Council has put forward several mitigation measures. Natural England said they would respond by 24 November 2023. In any case, the lead County Councillor John Riddle has asked for a site visit with all parties present. The new car park is proposed to help with the sustainability of Boulmer Memorial Hall and to take parking traffic off the village street. It is NOT attempting to provide parking for more vehicles than come to Boulmer than at present.







# **Storm Damage**

The recent high tides and north-sea-swell caused considerable damage along the coast. At Boulmer damage has been caused to the sea bank protecting the Beach Car Park. Huge rocks that were put down five years ago to stop the sea swilling away the sand have all collapsed and the sea has undermined the car park. This is to be taken up with the Environment Agency for it needs more rocks to be placed in this area to stop further erosion.



# THE STORY OF THE BATHING HOUSE AT HOWICK

# HOWICK HALL GARDENS AND ARBORETUM VOLUNTEERS

Having volunteered at Howick for two seasons now and enjoyed every minute of it I just wanted to say that we are always seeking more volunteers. Whatever your skills and interests, they will be appreciated and developed in a relaxed and very friendly way. You can join one of the practical teams working in the gardens and arboretum with however much time you want to give, or you can come and help visitors with information in the Visitor Centre, which is what I do on Friday afternoons in the season. You will always work along with like minds and we learn a lot from each other, especially about the family history and the collection of trees and plants which was developed through generations. If I was asked to name one big thing that I learnt there, it was that the arboretum's wild origin collection features two baby Bristlecone Pines. The Bristlecone Pine is found in North America and is the longest living organism on the planet. There are examples there believed to have lived for between four and five thousand years, which rather puts our revered Yews in the shade, so far as longevity goes! If you'd like information
