

NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN CONSULTATIONS: CHANGES

Following the reporting of good support for the proposed policies in December's newsletter, the Steering Group and Parish Council have now approved changes to the plan to reflect the concerns that were expressed, in the hope this will result in greater



support for the Plan. These changes are outlined below:

The allocation of housing to the north-east of Portal Place

This policy is to be removed from the Plan. It will remain as Protected Open Space and if there is a need for military housing in the future, it will require a planning application.

Housing on the former Johnnie Johnson site

This will be restricted to the boundary of the former Johnnie Johnson site. All proposals for a plaza outside the Co-operative store and an extension onto the Westfield Park site will be withdrawn.

The old recreation ground

The masterplan will be re-drawn so that there is a greater proportion of land used for informal recreation. The car park area will be better defined and the housing of 14 properties will be a mix of single and two storey properties of two or three bedrooms.

Boulmer South

The Masterplan will be changed so that there are 15 proposed properties on this site with a central green area.

Boulmer: requirement for permanent occupation

Independent confirmation will be sought to back up the statistics showing the need for this policy.

Next steps

The changes outlined above will be made to the Neighbourhood Plan.

The Plan will be submitted to Northumberland County Council (NCC) who will do a further assessment and consultation.

NCC will appoint an independent assessor who will carry out an assessment.

The Plan will be updated for any changes.

The Plan will be subject to a referendum.

LONGHOUGHTON PARISH COUNCIL: PRECEPT FOR 2024/25

Longhoughton Parish Council is to increase its Precept for 2024/25 to £26,798 from £23,582 in the current year. This increase reflects the need to implement a number of projects that are coming to completion and the acceptance of a higher standard of grass cutting by Northumberland County Council. Residents will start to pay the higher level from 01.04.24.

COMMUNITY SPEEDWATCH

You may have seen members of the Community Speedwatch team focusing their speed camera on your vehicle and taking your speed and, if you are speeding, taking your registration number. These exercises are being carried out in the 20 and 30mph zones in Longhoughton and Boulmer. So, beware, for anyone speeding will be reported to the Police and action will be taken. So far, 49 vehicles have been reported for speeding. More information about the scheme follows:

What is Community Speedwatch?

Community Speedwatch is a Northumbria Police initiative to improve road safety.

What does Community Speedwatch aim to do?

Reduce speed to prevent collisions.

Improve the quality of life for people in the area.

Raise public awareness of inappropriate speed.

Who are Cummunity Speedwatch Volunteers?

They are local volunteers who are recruited, vetted, trained and supervised by Northumbria Police. They operate speed detection equipment in accordance with relevant legislation, procedures and guidelines. Volunteers accurately record and document information collected as part of a Speedwatch and



report speeding vehicles to Northumbria Police for action. All information gathered is treated as personal data ensuring compliance with the Data Protection Act. The Police will also identify untaxed, untested and uninsured vehicles.

CLIMATE CHANGE ACTION GROUP

What can we do as a community to help cope with the ravages of climate change? Over the last two months we have experienced fearful storms which are all attributed to global warming. LACEY STREET CONGESTION

Considerable traffic congestion took place in Lacey Street particularly in December and over New Year. Parked traffic spread onto North End and caused further congestion and potential accidents. There is to be a public meeting for Lacey Street residents to discuss what can be done to lessen the impact on them. County Council representatives will be invited to attend the meeting. The longer term solution is to create a car park on the south end of the former Recreation field but that may take some time to obtain the planning approvals and find the funding.

LONGHOUGHTON BEACH CAR PARKING SCHEME

Parking charges at Longhoughton Beach Car Park were introduced by Howick Trustees Ltd from 11 January 2024. Longhoughton Parish Council has asked the County Council about classifying the lane to Longhoughton Beach Car Park as a 'Quiet Lane' which would make it much better for walkers

and cyclists. We await their response.




Boulmer is one of the most important places in Northumberland for shorebirds. As a group, shorebirds can be very tricky birds to identify, but because of the number of different species found there, Boulmer beach is a great place to go to start looking at the differences between the birds.

We run Shorebirds for Beginners events at Boulmer, as well as at other locations along the coast, to help give tips on what to look for when identifying the different species. Optics are provided and no prior knowledge is required to attend these free events as we start right at the beginning of bird ID.

ENCOURAGING PEOPLE TO USE BIKES AND WALKING

The Parish Council is very keen to encourage residents to use bikes and to enjoy walking. Both are very good for health and are recommended by health professionals. However, the Parish Council recognises that people want to walk and ride in a safe environment. For cycling, the ideal is to have a traffic free route and for walking there needs to be a good network of walking routes which are interesting and appealing. The development of greenways, which is proposed by the Parish Council, does provide cyclists and walkers with traffic-free routes, and for walkers the completion of the Howick Burn bridge will provide a wonderful three mile circuit from Longhoughton, talking in the coast.

BRIDGE OVER HOWICK BURN

In the December newsletter we reported that the bridge would be complete by the end of November. Bad weather caused this prediction to be untrue, so we do apologize to those people who walked down there expecting to use the new bridge. Anyway, good news, the bridge is now in place, and almost complete, but not yet ready to open for public use. There are still stiles and kissing gates to install further up the permissive path, and the track from the bridge to the burn mouth is deep in mud. Once the bridge is complete this will be an absolutely splendid circular walk from Longhoughton.

ASTRO-TURF PITCH NEEDS REPLACING

The Astro-turf pitch at the Longhoughton Community and Sports Centre is coming to the end of its useful life having been in use since it was installed in 2009. The Centre has a quote of just over £140,000 for a new pitch. The Centre has a fund of £70,000 accumulated from hire fees, but this still leaves a gap of £70,000. Applications for funding are being made to several potential funding organisations and so far £10,000 has been offered.

The floodlit pitch is used every night of the week

and at weekends by teams from Longhoughton Rangers Football Club. Several other groups including a 'walking football team' use it. The pitch is certified for matches to be played on the surface until 2026.
